MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

Habitat loss, boat strikes, and human impact have led to reduced numbers of manatees in Belize. Volunteer alongside a leading manatee conservation organization to help collect critical data on these creatures. Explore the three unique ecosystems where manatees are found, collecting data on the salinity of the water, currents, and number, size, and health of the local manatee population. This information is used by conservation groups to better protect the endangered West Indian Manatee.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Belize has one of the most unique blends of cultures in the Caribbean: a combination of Kriol, Maya, Mestizo, and African Garifuna, which yields a friendly and fascinating experience for visitors. You'll enjoy the vibrant and colorful culture of the Punta Gorda area, while also connecting with researchers and rangers working to protect the manatees.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Venture by boat to a remote island to snorkel along colorful reefs and relax on white sandy beaches. Raft through the rainforest and explore caves tucked deep in the jungle. Uncover ancient Maya culture by visiting archaelogical ruins and spending a day with a Maya family, learning to make cocoa and playing traditional instruments. Trek to a waterfall and swim in its cool waters.


LODGING

You'll spend your first night outside Belize City, followed by three nights at the ranger's station bunkhouse inside Payne's Creek National Park. Although rooms are rustic with shared bathrooms, the experience of living enveloped in a tropical park is unforgettable. The next three nights are at a 3-star oceanfront hotel in Punta Gorda, walking distance from shops and restaurants.



MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

The population of Costa Rican sea turtles has declined by 90% since 1980. Volunteer with a conservation organization and help ensure the survival of these fragile creatures. Depending on the time of year, you'll help protect the turtles by doing night patrols, collecting eggs, assisting researchers, or releasing hatchlings.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Visit inspirational conservationists who have dedicated themselves to rescuing and rehabilitating animals. Encounter a kaleidoscope of birds, as well as mammals like monkeys, pumas, ocelots, jaguars, and sloths. Become part of the movement to protect wildlife while also enjoying the "pura vida" lifestyle that makes Costa Rica one of the friendliest countries on earth.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Immerse yourself in Costa Rican nature on a variety of adventurous activities. Zip-line through the rainforest, raft down rivers surrounded by tropical birds, and stroll down pristine beaches. You'll also visit heartwarming animal rehabilitation centers.

LODGING

This program moves with the turtles. From January to July, we're on the Caribbean coast. You'll arrive in San Jose, spend a night near the capital, then three nights at a rustic bunkhouse near the turtle conservancy. The last three nights are at a comfortable 3-star beachfront lodge with a swimming pool.

From July to December, you'll arrive in Liberia, spend a night nearby, followed by four nights on the Pacific coast in private chalets near the beach. Chalets are equipped with air conditioning and have access to a swimming pool. The last two nights are at a 3-star lodge in the heart of the rainforest.

MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

Because Marino Ballena National Park is both a breeding and feeding ground for a variety of whales, it's critical to preserve it in the face of increasing tourism and development. We do a variety of community projects to raise environmental awareness; you could do everything from developing classroom activities and improving a recycling program to using GPS technology to create strategies to prevent ocean pollution.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

This off-the-beaten-path corner of Costa Rica still maintains its traditional way of life. Visit a farmer who will welcome you into his home and share how concepts like "organic" are simply how he's always done things. Meet artisanal fishermen who have become allies in the struggle to preserve the ocean, as well as scientists, activists and other "Ticos" eager to share their culture with you.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Discover gorgeous wildlife and fascinating flora in Corcovado National Park, called "one of the most biologically intense places on earth" by National Geographic. Scout for whales, dolphins and seals off the coast of the Whale Tail of Marino Ballena National Park. Whether you snorkel through an array of tropical fish or simply relax on the beach, you'll find yourself enjoying all the unique outdoor activities this town has to offer.


LODGING

Since Cuba's educational and medical systems are the envy of the region, volunteering looks very different here. Due to the US embargo, Americans and Cubans have only known what media outlets portray in their respective countries. The best way to help the Cuban people, therefore, is by rebuilding bridges of friendship and understanding between our people. By having direct people-to-people interactions, we can rebuild relations from the ground up — one traveler at a time.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Cuban culture is an eclectic fusion of Spanish, African, and Caribbean influences — and through your connections with the Cuban people, their one-of-a-kind culture will come alive. Enjoy a uniquely Cuban experience through Latin dance classes, visits to Afro-Cuban religious ceremonies, musical performances, and explorations of places with deep cultural significance.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Discover Havana, the capital city of fascinating history and charming architecture. See all the key sites such as Cathedral Square, Old Havana, and some of Ernest Hemingway's old haunts. From there, progress east and enjoy the smaller towns in the countryside. Discover the stark contrast between rural and urban life while visiting colonial towns, seaside villages, and UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

LODGING

We'll stay in a variety of accommodations, ranging from Spanish-style hotels with quirky characteristics, all the way to family-run bed and breakfasts, where you can really see how Cuban people live. You'll build health clinics and schools out of discarded plastic bottles, work on organic vegetable gardens, and be a friend and a role model for local children.

Get inspired by a Haitian doctor who is working to improve the health of his people. Meet organic honey farmers and taste the sweet fruit of their labors. Learn first-hand about the plight of Haitian migrants from local school teachers.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Live surrounded by idyllic beaches, upbeat Caribbean music, and an unmatched passion for baseball. Explore the tropical countryside by hiking to hidden waterfalls, riding a catamaran over the clear blue sea, and uncovering pristine beaches set amongst lush mountain landscapes. Visit famous sites in Puerto Plata such as the Mount Isabel gondola, amber museum, and a local rum distillery.



MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

Since the peace accords were signed in 1996, the indigenous Maya communities have been struggling to preserve their culture and fully claim their place in society. You'll beautify Mayan schools by painting or refurbishing classrooms, or developing educational games that reinforce the teacher's' lessons. These teaching aids live on after you depart as a form of solidarity and support for this community.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Discover the indigenous wisdom and traditions of Guatemala. Learn from a shaman who shares the secrets of Maya cosmology. Dive into Guatemala's rich culture by learning how to make colorful indigenous textiles and play the marimba (their national instrument). Discuss the challenges currently facing the Maya community with fascinating grassroots leaders.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Explore Guatemala's cultural treasures with a visit to Antigua, a charming colonial town with gorgeous colonial architecture and narrow cobblestone streets. Visit the largest craft market in the hemisphere, navigating locals selling everything from bright cloths to colorful flowers and medicinal plants. Trek to Lake Atitlan and experience its peaceful beauty.

LODGING

You'll be based four hours away from the capital city, in the town of Quetzaltenango. It is the epicenter of indigenous Maya art and music. On any given day, you will see local families in the narrow city streets adorned in brightly colored traditional fabrics, walking past artisan markets selling age-old handicrafts. In the distance, vast plains make way for volcanoes that scrape the sky.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS


Discover remnants of a well-preserved historic civilization, as well as a thriving modern culture. Our guides will facilitate meetings with fascinating people and organize hands-on cultural workshops. Whether you're meeting with the founder of a school, spending time with a Quechua family, or learning from a traditional shaman, you'll experience the many dimensions of this rich and fascinating culture.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Go back in history by visiting some of the best known archaeological sites around Cusco. In the cathedrals, learn about the unique fusion of indigenous religion and Spanish Catholicism that occurred in the 17th century. At the Home Base, learn about traditional Andean textiles and Peruvian cooking. Cap off your trip with a visit to the famed ancient city of Machu Picchu.

LODGING

Only 45 minutes away from the city of Cusco lies a small town where cobblestone streets meander by traditional Peruvian houses. Children dance around the town plaza, chasing each other past old men deep in discussion. The Andes soar in the distance, in stunning contrast to the bright mountain sky. This pueblo will be your base for most of the trip, aside from a few nights in Cusco.

MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

Though Kruger National Park is the largest reserve in the country, its animals face many different threats. You'll use camera traps to assist a leopard conservation organization gather data on leopard density, behavior, and population dynamics outside of formally protected areas. This will help improve local policymaking and allow conservationists to work with farmers to manage leopard encroachment.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Meet conservationists working to protect endangered species and personally support their efforts to protect leopards. Along the way, you'll get up close and personal with a variety of wildlife in a way most travelers never do: you'll hold lion cubs, nurse baby rhinos, and feed injured animals. This trip allows you to go far beyond the safari -- you'll become part of the wildlife conservation movement!

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

The Greater Kruger National Park region is comprised of more than 7,500 square miles of protected land and has been designated as a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO. It's home to more than 500 species of birds and contains more species of large mammals than any other African reserve. Within this region, it's possible to spot all "Big 5" (lion, elephant, Cape buffalo, leopard and rhinoceros).

LODGING

Your home-away-from-home, the Discover Corps basecamp, is a deluxe tented camp on the banks of the Blyde River It features a common building with a dining area and panoramic private deck, where you can enjoy the sights and sounds of the bush. Rooms include crisp white linens, a plush bed, full private bathroom with hot and cold water, hairdryer, lockbox, and fan. You'll also be able to enjoy an infinity pool, wi-fi, hiking trails, and an assortment of South African beer and wine for sale.

Tanzania EAST AFRICA UNVEILED

Discover the heart, soul, and wildlife of East Africa.

- Volunteering with local children at a village primary school
- Scanning the African savannah for zebras, elephants, lions, and rhinos



MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

Schools in rural areas suffer from overcrowded classrooms and deteriorating infrastructure. Assist in a local primary school by teaching English and basic math. Volunteer alongside teachers to develop instructional aids that enrich the curriculum. When not in the classroom, help to improve the school's infrastructure by planting gardens and refurbishing classrooms.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Though the media may portray Africa in a negative light, this is your opportunity to see the true heartbeat of Tanzania: the welcoming people who make this country great. Visit local non-profit organizations and meet with inspirational grassroots leaders working hard to improve the lives of their people. Work side-by-side with teachers and their smiling students. Enjoy guest speakers, dance performances and hands-on cultural workshops while learning to make African batik and other beautiful handicrafts.

ENGAGING EXPLORATION

Take a nature walk to a stunning waterfall along the base of Mount Kilimanjaro, the tallest mountain in Africa. Enjoy the jeep ride of a lifetime in two of the world's most famous safari parks: Ngorongoro Crater and Tarangire National Park. Connect with the Masai and learn about their unique, age-old nomadic culture by throwing spears, learning traditional dances, and making jewelry.

LODGING

Rising above the African plains, Mount Kilimanjaro is the backdrop of your Home Base. Located off the narrow dirt roads in a village outside of Moshi, you'll be in the center of Tanzanian culture. Walk down the road and inevitably be greeted with a handshake and a loud "Jambo!" The Chagga tribe, who are local to this region, are incredibly friendly and eager to share their customs and history.

MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEERISM

In Thailand, speaking English is essential for getting a good job. The traditional Thai education system, however, emphasizes rote learning. Our travelers have a simple mission: to make learning English fun! 
LODGING
